

Todd Twatchmann, Cedar Rapids, IA



Todd Twatchmann was born on July 7, 1964 and displayed gifted athleticism as a teenager in the greater Cedar Rapids, IA area. He was a four-sport athlete at Marion High School and excelled at football and baseball at Dartmouth College.

Equally as important at college he won an award as "the best all around athlete with regard to moral worth and high standing in scholarship". That is a rare combination and speaks volumes to the Todd's character.

Todd competed in the ISC World Championship for 16 seasons (1991-2006) with Cedar Rapids, IA Bosch-Rausch, Des Moines, IA

Metros, Decatur, IL Pride, Green Bay, WI All Car Roadrunners, St. Joseph, MO Meierhoffer-Fleeman and his final six seasons with Madison, WI Farm Tavern. He was selected to the Second ISC All-World Team in 2000 and 2001, and finished his career with back-to-back First All-World Team selections in 2005-06 when the Farm Tavern finished in the final four both years. In 16 years, teams on which Todd played finished in the Final Four on nine occasions, and he played in three ISC Championship games.

Todd's on-field softball skills were admirable and placed him among the elite of the sport. Equally as relevant were his off-field attributes that enabled him to be a consummate teammate.

Teammates Jody Hennigar (ISC HoF 2011) shared "Todd displayed a difference-maker attitude" and Michael White (ISC HoF 2009) stresses that Todd's on-field "honors pale in comparison to the way he handled himself as a teammate and competitor... a gentleman of the game who always conducted himself with integrity and honesty. You could always trust that Todd would give you a truthful and unbiased opinion - and his opinion counted."

As well, John Ege (ISC HoF 1996) states that Todd "was a team leader by example.... In a very business-like and professional manner... and displayed outstanding character traits administering respect to sponsors, coaches and teammates."

Todd's softball knowledge and ability to see the big picture resulted in his serving as an ISC player rep for nine seasons.
